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# ABOUT CBB

## Main facts

The Association des Compagnons Bâisseurs, aka CBB, is a non-profit organization recognized and financially supported as **Youth Organization** by the Brussels-Wallonia Federation since 1978. It is member of the ALLIANCE of European Voluntary Service Organizations since 1997. In Belgium, CBB is member of the federation of the pluralist and independent youth organizations. Very recently, CBB also became member of the CCIVS.

As Youth Organization, CBB is managed by young volunteers. 6 Board members out of 8 and 77% of the members of the general assembly are below 35 years old.

## Values, principles and objectives

CBB recognizes itself in a value of **active pluralism**. The participation in our projects always leaves the participants free to make their own choice and decision concerning their personal, cultural, political or philosophical orientation and involvements provided that these orientations respect the personal situation and the dignity of any other member of the society, as well as the core values of the Universal Declaration on Human Rights.

All the actions of the organization are based on the principles of non-formal education (in the French meaning of **Popular Education**). Our projects aim to support the development of active citizens, capable of sense of responsibility, criticism and solidarity. They offer a **space for interaction and expression** of people from diverse origins and abilities, with the objective to raise their awareness on societal challenges (from a local to a more global level), to create new links of solidarity among them and among their communities, and to support their full participation in the society.

In that sense, any project or activity in CBB promotes:

- **The empowerment of free, autonomous and responsible individuals.** Our projects encourage processes of **social and cultural emancipation**, meaning that they exhort their participants to reflect on the place they occupy in the society and on the role they can and they want to assume in it.
- **The meeting beyond the differences.** Our projects encourage the awareness of the richness of human diversity and the creation of new social links.
- **The practice of active citizenship and the promotion of volunteering:** by taking part in our projects, the volunteer will experiment new ways of participation and will be encouraged to take responsibility in their communities.
- **The informal and non-formal learning processes:** the participation in our projects must permit the acquirement and development of competences such as self-confidence, autonomy, intercultural competences, leading skills, manual, social or linguistics abilities...

## Our programs and activities

CBB mainly develops its action with 6 permanent programs of activities:

- The international workcamps (short term volunteering projects within an international group)
- The week-end workcamps (volunteering projects for local groups during the week-end)
- The mid- and long-term volunteering projects, including long-term volunteering projects supported by the European Solidarity Corps
- The leisure time activities (of variable duration, ranging from one evening to more than a week), thought for mixed groups of volunteers and people in situation of disability, which are oriented towards meetings and collective action
- The leaders trainings (for volunteering projects and also for kids camps)
- The Youth Exchanges

## Our public and human resources

Our activities are developed thanks to a network of around 500 committed persons, more than 200 international volunteers and participants during the summer and a team of 12 employees and 3 European volunteers.

We are a Youth Organization and most of our public is aged between 16 and 25 years, even if there is no upper age limit to integrate our groups of volunteers.

Our public is diverse. Around 30 nationalities are yearly represented in our projects.

We also implement strategies to facilitate the participation of people from disadvantaged economic and social background, as well as individuals in situation of disability. A clear result of this strategy is that, among our members, more than 80 people are in situation of disability.

## Our level of action

CBB is based in a semi-rural area. The only office of the organization is located in Marche-en-Famenne, a 17 500 inhabitants town at 110 km from Brussels, the capital of Belgium.

We organize our projects in the territory of the Brussels-Wallonia Federation of Belgium, which means that our projects take place in the French speaking part of the country.

In the frame of our international projects, we maintain partnerships with more than 91 organizations and 48 countries from Africa, Asia, America and Europe.

# ABOUT OUR WORKCAMPS

## Local host

All our projects answer the needs of the local communities and are organized for the common good.

They are arranged in collaboration with local non-profit organizations or with local authorities. Our partners recognize themselves in the values and goals promoted by CBB: active citizenship, richness of the interculturality and human diversity, importance of youth empowerment and youth participation.

The local hosts are deeply involved in the preparation and implementation of the projects. They are in charge of organizing the work and helping the volunteers in their tasks. They are also responsible for supporting the meeting between the international volunteers and the community.

It is the local hosts who cover the lodging and food costs of the volunteers.

## Camp leaders

One or two group leaders, prepared by CBB, participate in each camp and are responsible for facilitating the community life.

These leaders are volunteers with previous experience in volunteering projects and prepared to lead a group.

The camp leaders in CBB have a volunteer status, but they receive a little money from our organization (120€/week) in order to cover their expenses. The amount provided to the leaders of teenage camps is larger than in the case of adult camps and could be compared to paid labor.

Every year, CBB organizes a specific training (3 days long) for its workcamp leaders.

We are also happy to host leaders trained and recommended by our partners.

The group leaders share all the aspects of the workcamp with the international volunteers. They participate in the volunteers' tasks as well as in the daily life and in the leisure time activities.

In every project there are also one or two technical leaders who are in charge of organizing and facilitating the work. These technical leaders are workers or volunteers from the local host. They are mainly present during the working days and do not participate in the residential life.

## Teenager projects

CBB proposes every year workcamps for teenagers (15-17 years old).

Teenage camps are seen as usual volunteering projects in CBB. They are a tool used to foster the non-formal and informal learning of the participants.

There is no difference with an adult camp for what regards the organization and the duration of the work.

As in any camp, the volunteers actively participate in the management of their group life. They decide together about their cultural visits and leisure time activities. They organize their menu and share all the daily life tasks.

A participation fee of 150€ is charged by CBB for its teenage projects. This is the main difference with the adult camps, which are always free of charge.

The money gathered with the participation fees is used to cover:

- extra allowance given to the qualified camp leaders
- leisure time activities of the group.

A **parental authorization and a medical facts sheet** are requested from the volunteers who want to take part in a teenage camp.

## Inclusion policy (A4A)

CBB is deeply committed to the ALLIANCE Access for All campaign.

We are convinced that the international volunteering projects represent a great added educational value for those who take part in them. This is true for everybody and that is why we do our best to make our projects benefit as many people as possible.

Beyond the politically correct statement, there are acts to be undertaken. We must recognize that, because of economic, social, educational or geographical difficulties, or because of a disability, some have fewer opportunities to benefit from the learning experience that our projects offer to the volunteers.

That is why CBB fully subscribes with the ALLIANCE A4A policy. When needed, we can also implement a differentiated registration and follow-up process (using the A4A tools).

An "Access for All" placement should be requested only if a specific support from our side is necessary. If there is no need of extra support from our side, we do not want to know whether the volunteer is considered to have fewer opportunities or not. We will just be pleased to host "a volunteer".

We ask the sending organizations to use the A4A "pre-departure form" and provide us with all the information we need to know in order to orientate the candidate to a suitable project and ensure their appropriate hosting conditions.

## **ABOUT OUR VOLUNTEERING TEAMS (ESC financed projects)**

### **The European Solidarity Corps (ESC)**

The European Solidarity Corps is the new single entry point for solidarity activities supported by the European Union. The ESC includes the previous European Voluntary Service (EVS) activities, but also offers support to a range of new activities. Among them, the volunteering teams.

CBB has concluded a partnership agreement with the Bureau International Jeunesse, the Belgian (French speaking) national agency, which permits us to organize several volunteering teams in 2019, 2020 and 2021.

### **A new format for workcamps**

The volunteering teams mostly cope with the definition of a workcamp, in the sense that they permit a group of minimum 10 participants coming from different countries to volunteer together for a period of time ranging from 2 weeks to 2 months.

The main difference between the volunteering team and the workcamp is that the volunteering teams are supported by a European project grant, which implies several new rights and responsibilities for the volunteers as well as for the participating organizations.

It is necessary that the projects and the volunteers are registered in the PASS, the Placement and Administration Support System of the Solidarity Corps.

### **Our projects type and our local partners**

In 2020, CBB volunteering teams are all social projects, organized in partnership with reception centres for asylum seekers established in the Belgian French community.

The European volunteers will integrate in the reception centres and will share the residents' daily life. The volunteers will organize and facilitate leisure time activities. They will also carry out manual tasks, such as painting, gardening and helping with the maintenance of the centres.

### **Origin countries and sending organizations of the volunteers**

The participation in the Volunteering teams is limited to participants from EU members and partner countries, as well as countries neighbouring the EU, such as the Russian Federation, the Western Balkans, the Eastern Partnership and the South-Mediterranean countries.

CBB truly counts on the support of the ALLIANCE member and partner organizations established in these countries to inform and prepare the volunteers who will attend the projects. In advance, we also deeply thank our usual sending partners for their support.

## Rights and conditions of the volunteers with the ESC

Compared to the usual workcamp participation scheme, some main financial and administrative differences must be underlined:

- The participation to the ESC volunteering teams is subjected to several principles and conditions, presented in the ESC webpage: [https://europa.eu/youth/solidarity/mission\\_en](https://europa.eu/youth/solidarity/mission_en).
- The volunteers do not have to pay any fee (not sending nor participation fee) to attend the project.
- The volunteers will receive pocket money, calculated on the basis of 4€/day upon their arrival in Belgium.
- The volunteers will receive a financial support for their travel, according to a maximum amount established in accordance with their travel distance.
- The volunteers need to register in the European Solidarity Corps Portal; CBB will organize their matching with the volunteering project in the online platform,
- The volunteers will have to complete a participation report 30 days after their participation at the latest.

## Financial conditions for the sending partners

At the term of the volunteering team project, the sending organizations will receive from CBB:

100€ of sending activity costs

Travel support according to the travel distance of the volunteer:

- 180€ for a travel between 100 and 499 km
- 275€ for a travel between 499 and 1999km
- 360€ for a travel between 2000 and 2999km
- 530€ for a travel between 3000 and 3999km

In order to receive the money, the sending organization is requested to submit to CBB:

- An invoice, stating the due amounts
- A signed declaration of the volunteer, confirming the travel support was given by the sending organization in full or in form of provision

## The projects promotion, communication and placement process

- CBB ESC team projects are published in the European Solidarity Corps Placement Administration and Support System (PASS)
- CBB ESC team projects are also published in PLATO. The specific ESC format will be clearly identified in the project code and description.
- Applications must be carried out through a sending partner, via PLATO or email, by sending the usual VEF and answering to a standard questionnaire.
- CBB will confirm the placement via PLATO.
- Once the placement is confirmed, CBB will directly contact the volunteers and, if not done yet, ask them to register in the ESC Placement and Administration Support System and to ensure the matching with the project.
- Once the placement is confirmed, CBB will provide the volunteers with the CIGNA insurance.
- If needed, the sending organization must be available to support the volunteer and CBB in these processes.
- A detailed project infosheet will be sent to the sending organizations and the volunteers four weeks before the beginning of the project at the latest.
- Upon arrival, CBB will deliver a small info session about the ESC.
- At the end of the project, CBB will contact the volunteers and invite them to fill in their final report.



## The project

The non-profit association "Andage" aims to develop innovative projects and responses suitable to the needs of people with light mental disabilities and their families in the Province of Luxembourg and the Walloon Region. Their mission includes:

- Individual support: as much as possible, Andage beneficiaries live by themselves. Nevertheless, they need a small support in daily life, different according to their specific needs: helping them to wake up in the morning, keep the house clean, take the train on time...
- Collective activities: Andage seeks the development of numerous partnerships with the associative world in order to answer the occupational desires of their beneficiaries (help with the animals, youth clubs, etc.)
- Community actions: Andage seeks to develop partnerships to raise awareness among the outside world about the inclusion of its beneficiaries.

"Renforts Andage" is the local branch of the organization based in Marche-en-Famenne. Renforts' public is mostly composed of people with light to very light mental disabilities. Throughout the years, Renforts and CBB collaborated in many occasions through the yearly hosting of an ESC volunteer, hosting of youth exchanges and other activities, even providing food according to special diets during the Alliance General Conference held in Mozet in 2020.

This will nevertheless be our first workcamp together, and both organizations are very excited about it!

By taking part in this project, you will help people with mental disabilities throughout their daily life (UN SDG 10 Reduced inequalities).

## Work

At the moment, Renforts is developing a new space in order to offer occupational activities to their beneficiaries about the topics of environment and permaculture. Renforts also wants to offer everyone the possibility to have walks which stimulate all the five senses in this very space. Currently, a barefoot path already exists to stimulate the sense of touch.

In collaboration with the organization staff and its beneficiaries, the team of volunteers will think about a way to stimulate hearing, using for example carillons, sound walls, ... and the sense of smell by planting aromatics and fragrant plants. The volunteer's ideas are very welcome!

## Food and accommodation

Accommodation can be compared to a boarding school (Saint François complex): a corridor with double bedrooms; toilets and showers are at the same floor. No smoking inside.

Food will be arranged in the form of self-catering. Bring your recipes to enjoy 'kitchen life'!

## Location

Marche-en-Famenne is a city in the countryside and it is also the home town of CBB! You can find everything here: schools, supermarkets, industries... But still, it is surrounded by woods, fields and small villages where the life rhythm remains rural. Liège, Namur, Brussels and Luxembourg can be easily reached by train in about one hour.

## The project

Les Chemins d'Ariane located in Ciney is an institution recognized as "Medical and Social Institute" (IMS). The mission of an IMS is to welcome, help and accompany people in need (disabled, old and convalescent people) through various social and medical services. The Chemins d'Ariane is a residential service that hosts around 330 people with a mental disability and/or illness.

A staff of professionals (educators, doctors, nurses...) is involved to facilitate the daily life of residents and to support their autonomy as much as possible. Workshops and leisure activities are used as a way to get participants involved and enhance their capabilities.

By participating in this project, you will help people with mental disabilities or illnesses throughout their daily life, creating a welcoming environment where to learn and promote well-being (UN SDG 3 Good health and well-being, UN SDG 10 Reduced inequalities).

## Work

The volunteers will help the staff accompany people with disabilities in their daily life within the center.

Mostly, they will be involved in different activities together with the center beneficiaries as well as with the local volunteers, such as excursions, games, walks with the residents...

The project will have an important pedagogical part. Indeed, by volunteering in this project, you will learn a lot about how to care for people with disabilities of various ages.

BEWARE: some activities are organized during the week-ends and the volunteers might then have free time during the week instead.

## Food and accommodation

Your team will be accommodated in a dormitory with access to showers and bathrooms. Food will be provided by the kitchen staff of the center.

Volunteers must notify us beforehand about specific dietary needs.

## Location

Ciney is a small but a very pleasant town with about 15.000 inhabitants. You can find all the necessary facilities there (supermarkets, shops, restaurants, ...). The town is well known for its special beers. Ciney is located about 30km from Namur, more or less 100 km from Brussels or Liège.

## The project

Created in 1937, the non-profit association "Kaleo" aims to promote youth social tourism by paying particular attention to economically and culturally disadvantaged people and their development. Kaleo manages a network of more than 30 simple and qualitative accommodations located in different villages in Wallonia, the southern part of Belgium.

At the same time, they offer various types of activities (discovery classes, summer courses, annual events, weekends, theme breaks, etc...) with a support service for their organization.

## The project

The aim of this camp is to offer to people with light mental disability the possibility to go on vacation with young international volunteers. During the workcamp, they share leisure time activities, make cultural visits and, above all, have fun. Thanks to this camp, people with learning disabilities that otherwise wouldn't be able to go on vacation can leave their parents and their daily life to spend some time with other adults of their age. The volunteers and the CBB staff will accompany them in their leisure time and help them with their daily tasks. There will be 12 people with learning disabilities, 8 volunteers and one group leader. The disabled people are between 18 and 50 year old.

## Work

## The project

The *Jumet Charleroi Asylum Seeker Centre* hosts people who have asked for asylum in Belgium. Many of them fled from war or persecution. Before these people can start their new lives, their refugee status has to be proven and accepted. While waiting for the documents that will enable them to remain legally in our country, the asylum seekers are accommodated in this centre.

People living there await the answer concerning their administrative status. They never know what tomorrow may bring them.

Therefore, residents often find themselves overwhelmed by feelings of relief and anguish, hope and disappointment. The life in *Jumet Charleroi Asylum Seeker Centre* reflects these individual cases often filled with drama, but also hopefulness and laughter of residents.

By volunteering in this project, you are actively helping the centre welcome people coming from a wide variety of difficult situations and take care of them while they are waiting for a response to their asylum request (UN SDG 10 Reduced inequalities).

## Work

The final work will be confirmed but mostly will involve manual outdoor work such as creating a vegetable garden or other gardening tasks.

## Accommodation

Volunteers will be hosted in "La Consoude", an ancient convent now refurbished as a non-profit organisation that promotes urban revitalization, socio-cultural and artistic, sports, promotion of short circuits initiatives, social inclusion and environmental awareness.

A space for sharing, exchanging ideas and skills, “La Consoude” is above all a place of experimentation related to the alternatives ways of life.

The accommodation is not close to the center. Shuttles will be provided.

## Food

Some meals will be taken in the center and some in the accommodation.

## Location

Charleroi is the largest city of the French speaking part of Belgium. It's considered a major road, rail and flight junction. Charleroi is an industrial centre but it also has an important cultural dimension due to its numerous museums and cultural activities. It is the birthplace of many cartoon drawing talents whose statues adorn the city.

During the weekend it will be possible to organize cultural visits and travel to other Belgian cities, easily reachable by train.

## Meeting Point

The 08<sup>th</sup> of August at Charleroi-South train station at 3.00pm.

## Camp language

English is the official language, but some knowledge of French will be useful.

In the center, you can find a lot of people from all over the world, so you have a chance to discover many other languages! Facial expression, sign language and emotional interjections may also help you in any situation! Feel free to try!

## Specific requirements

This project is composed of a volunteering team, supported by the European Solidarity Corps program of the European Union.

Compared to the usual workcamp participation scheme, some main financial and administrative differences must be underlined:

- The participation to the ESC volunteering teams is subjected to several principles and conditions, presented on the ESC webpage: [https://europa.eu/youth/solidarity/mission\\_en](https://europa.eu/youth/solidarity/mission_en)

- The volunteers do not have to pay any fees (not sending, nor participation fee) to attend the project
- The volunteers will receive pocket money, calculated on a 4€/day basis, once they arrive in the project in Belgium
- The volunteers will receive a financial support for their travel :
  - 180€ for a travel between 100 and 499 km
  - 275€ for a travel between 499 and 1999km
  - 360€ for a travel between 2000 and 2999km
  - 530€ for a travel between 3000 and 3999km
- The volunteers need to register on the European Solidarity Corps Portal ; CBB will organize their the matching with the correct project in the online system.
- The volunteers will have to complete a participation report, submitted online through the ESC portal.

We warn the volunteers that the consumption of alcohol is strictly forbidden inside the centre.

Volunteers must be sensitive and aware of the great diversity of the audience that the centre welcomes, in terms of age, nationalities, lifestyle, life stories, but also great cultural differences.

Residents also live in the "the uncertainty of tomorrow" and can experience significant stress. The meetings that the volunteers are going to lead there can provoke certain feelings in residents and volunteers must have this in mind in order to deal with it and ask for help.

The centre draws the attention of the volunteers to the importance of keeping a "professional distance" with residents (this can avoid conflicts), as well as of respecting the internal rules.

This project seeks volunteers with a good level of motivation for its theme and those who are prepared to integrate in the life of an asylum seekers center. We recommend them to already have an idea about the policy concerning refugees in their country.

In order to demonstrate this, we ask the candidate volunteers to:

- send a short motivation letter
- answer our specific questionnaire (if you do not have it yet, please ask your sending organization for it).
- send us a certificate of good conduct

We will not confirm any placement requests before analyzing the submitted forms.
